## Task 1: HMM Parameters

Suppose we have a hidden Markov model with $N$ states, each of which can output one of $k$ observation symbols, and we have an observation sequence of length $T$. Our HMM is represented by $\lambda=(A, B, \pi)$, where $A$ represents the transition parameters, $B$ represents the emission parameters, and $\pi$ represents the initial starting state parameters.

For $\pi$, how many initial starting state parameters does our model have?
For $A$, how many transition parameters does our model have?
For $B$, how many emission parameters does our model have?

What percentage of the variance in the data is explained by the first two principal components?
